


WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE

The site of the Hancock Bridge Massacre of 1778, where Major John Graves Simcoe led 300 British soldiers and Queen’s Rangers to surround and surprise members of the local militia, along with Judge Hancock. The Hancock House can be found on the National Register of Historic Places and is a must-see for history buffs.

Home to Mannington Meadows, Salem River has been cited by New Jersey Monthly as “the perfect destination to spot local wildlife” and “one of the top areas in the state for water-fowl diversity.” Enjoy a breath of fresh air and connect with nature on the viewing platform overlooking an expansive marsh along Mannington Creek.
